Successful DRUG TAKE BACK / SHRED TRUCK FUNDRAISER!

The Walla Walla Police Department, College Place Police Department, and the Walla Walla County Sheriff's Office held two very successful Take Back Drug Days / Shred Truck Fundraiser at the WW Police Department, Waitsburg Fire Station, and at the Wal Mart Parking lot **this past weekend April 29**th and **30**th.

Combined Totals for the Weekend:

561.9 pounds of DRUGS were collected Saturday April 29th and Sunday April 30th

WW Police Dept 393 lbs of Drugs 4,000 lbs of shred material

College Place Police Dept – at Walmart 153 lbs of Drugs 3,800 lbs of shred material

WW County Sheriff – at Waitsburg Fire Dept 15.9 lbs of Drugs 600 lbs of shred material

The Shred Truck Fundraiser raked in a total of \$2,495.07 in donations to benefit Walla Walla Area Crime Watch, a non-profit organization that supports Crime Prevention / Partnership / Education in the Walla Walla Valley.

2016 comparables:

In April of 2016 was a one day event involving 3 agencies:

Walla Walla PD: 360 lbs of Drugs

College Place PD: 60 lbs of Drugs

WW County Sheriff: 30 lbs of Drugs

1 Shred Truck was shared totaling 7,000 lbs \$1,267.11 in donations

The Drug Take Back Day is sponsored by the DEA, Drug Enforcement Agency, across the country. In the previous 12 Take Back events over 7 million pounds of pills have been turned in, according to the DEA.

Proper disposal of unwanted medicines is important. Most abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. They can lead to overdoses and accidental poisonings.

Once-common methods of disposal, such as flushing medicines down the toilet or throwing them in the trash, pose potential safety and health hazards the DEA said.

The donations that were received will benefit Walla Walla Area Crime Watch and continue supporting Crime Prevention activities and events in the Walla Walla Valley!
